








## **Policy Platform**

- Seeking MHC member approval by 1/31/2019
- Structure of Policy Platform & Work Plan
- Three priority areas:
  - 1. Build political identity and influence outside Tahoe-Truckee region;
  - Change or remove <u>policy barriers</u> to implementing achievable local housing in region;
  - Remove barriers to <u>attracting funding</u> for achievable local housing projects in the region.

#### 2019 Activities

- Identify and engage on 1 to 3 high-priority bills
- MHC in State Capitol Day
- Engage on Props. 1 & 2 program development
- Match regional projects with potential funding sources
- Engage on 2017 housing package implementation
- Coordinate advocates and work with partners



## 2019-20 Legislative Session: Sneak Peek

- New administration: goal to build 3.5 million new housing units by 2025
- Likely policy focus areas for Legislature:
- Streamlining and incentivizing affordable housing development (SB 50)
- Reinstating redevelopment agencies (SB 15)
- Expanding development and utilization of ADUs (SB 13, AB 68, AB 69)
- Stabilizing rental prices (AB 36)
- Building decarbonization and accelerating zero net energy buildings
- Housing in Governor's budget



## New Budget + Housing Highlights

- Total: \$7.7 billion across multiple agencies and programs
- \$750m: One-time General Fund for technical support and general funding to local governments to jump-start housing production
- The Newsom Administration will be developing a strategy to revamp the Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) process
- \$500m: One-time General Fund for housing development for for moderate-income households through the CA Housing Finance Authority (CalHFA) to expand its Mixed-Income Loan Program.
- \$500m: Expansion of the state tax credit program (\$200m for 60-80AMI)
- Encourage use of Enhanced Infrastructure Financing Districts (EFIDs) by pairing them with the federal Opportunity Zones





#### Placer Local Funding Update

- BAE: Placer County Housing Finance Strategy Creating
- TOT, sales tax and potential TBID revenue
- ID needs including achievable and cost
- Look at a look at an affordable housing "credit" or exchange program



#### **Town of Truckee Local Funding Update**

- Potential funding sources study completed by BAE and reviewed by the Town Council in June 2018
- Looking into hiring a consultant to look at polling and feasibility of potential tax options, including TOT and parcel taxes



## Bay Area Secures 2B for Housing in 2016. How did they do it?

- Political program with data (strategy, data, resident mobilization)
- SF Foundation donation to build regional data base, outreach strategy, materials, stories
- Fundraising--\$5M (Advocacy Fund @Tides Foundation)
- Leverage partners, network, residents



### **2018 Housing Bonds**

City of Berkeley

- 135M in bonds
- \$23/\$100,000 assessed value
- For: students, low, middle income, teachers, homeless...

| Measure O: Berkeley Housing Bonus |        |            |

| Result                            | Votes  | Percentage |
| ✓ Yes                             | 42,384 | 77.48%     |

## 2018 Local Housing Bond

#### San Jose Housing Bond

- Up to 120% AMI—working families, vets, teachers, nurses, homeless
- Property Tax assessment: \$.08 cents/1,000 assessed value
- 66.67=win

| Measure V: San Jose Housing Bond Issue |         |            |
|--|---------|------------|
| Result                                 | Votes   | Percentage |
| Yes                                    | 177,525 | 64.01%     |
| <b>¥</b> No                            | 99,816  | 35.99%     |
