

GOVERNOR'S PROPOSED BUDGET

FY 22-23



- New Statewide Housing Plan & RHNA #s by mid year
- Proposed budget fully funds the \$20b FY21-22 commitments
- Housing: \$9 billion
 - \$500 million Infill Infrastructure
 - \$300 million AHSC
 - \$1.06 billion LIHTC
- Homelessness: \$8 billion
 - \$4.2 billion in intervention programs
 - \$1.3 billion in Project Homekey

Big Question: How much of excess surplus goes to housing



TOP ISSUES EMERGING



- Nexus between wildfire and housing
- Focus on infill development
- Housing in AB 32 Scoping Plan Update
- Merging state housing policy and climate policy
- Wildfire insurance reform
- "Social Housing" fund

- Support Governor's budget

PROPOSAL REVIEW: TAHOE BASIN MOTEL CONVERSION TO 13 WORKFORCE HOUSING UNITS

Ask: \$1M to provide bridge all cash offer 90-180 day gap funding

Outcome: The Applicant secured needed funding from outside sources but wasn't successful in acquiring the property

Lessons Learned: Path forward isn't easy for smaller developers or for the property owners

- Obtaining insurance is challenging & expensive
- Too many barriers & time constraints to move quickly & acquire small-medium parcels for renovation projects
- Recognize that there is desire for nimble capital

WHO ARE OUR UNHOUSED NEIGHBORS?

We have 45 individuals registered in our Homeless Management Information System (HMIS), which provides a 'By Name' list of individuals experiencing homelessness in our region

- Other newly homeless (increase since COVID) and many additional neighbors are not counted and are living under-sheltered in their cars and other places not meant for habitation
- 26 individuals have been housed, since January 2021.
 Representing a **50 percent reduction** in those experiencing homelessness in our region
 - 19 chronically homeless and 7 newly homeless
 - 3 of these neighbors here less than 1 year
 - 8 here 1-5 years
 - 1 here 5-10 years
 - 14 here 10+ years



EMERGENCY WARMING CENTER AND DAY CENTER CURRENT STATISTICS

Data from July 2021 through January 18,2022

Day Center:

- 184 Individual Guests
- 1,363 Total Guest Visits
 - 1,374 Meals
 - 561 Showers
 - 202 Loads of laundry

Emergency Warming Center:

- Open 18 nights
- 29 Individual Guests
- 195 Total Guest Visits
 - 16 visits for dinner & services
 - 179 visits overnight
- Plus 20 stranded on 12/25 and 18 stranded on 12/27



2022 POINT IN TIME COUNT NIGHT OF FEBRUARY 23RD

Represents a count of unsheltered people experiencing homelessness on a single night of February 23rd.

The count is vital in determining the scope of homelessness, defining existing resources available and identifying gaps to better serve these individuals.
