Built for Zero Truckee Tahoe Strategy	<ul> <li>■ Truckee/Tahoe subgroup target: chronically homeless</li> <li>○ Recent Point in Time Count, 44 people with 28 people in Nevada County and 16 people in Placer County.</li> <li>■ Most are single men</li> <li>■ A few are veterans</li> <li>■ Chronically homeless with substance abuse or other debilitating conditions</li> <li>■ We know that the total number is higher than 44 in our area because some people denied entry into the HMIS system.</li> </ul>	

	■ Truckee Police Department responds to calls involving approximately 12 chronically homeless individuals.	
Truckee Tahoe Strategy - Collaboration	<ul> <li>Explore a comprehensive, weekly/monthly meeting with providers and law enforcement.</li> <li>Who should be involved?</li> <li>Currently Nevada County case management meeting requires all to have to HMIS license due to confidentiality/release of information and focuses on the whole county</li> <li>Placer County homeless response-officers don't have HMIS. Have homeless liaisons that have HMIS licenses and do the reporting for law enforcement.</li> <li>Truckee Police Department has created a prosecution strategy with DA office regarding the chronic homeless.</li> </ul>
