Homelessness & Supportive Housing Services Updates (Cathie Foley) Day Respite Center/Homeless Service Location & Updates	 Day Respite Center/Homeless Service Update Open Tuesday-Thursday, 9am-2pm in the backyard at Church of the Mountains. This opens up resources for more street outreach. The Emergency Warming Center will more then likely continue at Church of the Mountains (not formal yet). Weather-triggered criteria will be the same as last year, but weekly open nights will be declared the Friday before (no longer day of). Planning for 40-50 nights. Mark DiGiacomo is helping NTTHS find office space to have the ability to hire more staff for coordination/administration work, which will free up Danielle for outreach. 	 Truckee Artist Lofts: 4 individuals have moved into <u>Truckee Artist Lofts</u>, and 2 more moving in soon. Coldstream Commons: 12 applicants for the 811 units. 8 applicants for the general units. No one is confirmed yet- likely at least 6 for the 811. Not sure for general units.

Any program will need to have existing infrastructure (water/bathrooms) and agency involvement.	MHC is looking for champions beyond the Tiger Team. Cathie recommends reaching out to the business owners who pitched the idea and that United for Action could help support the effort. II. Preparing for Power Outages & Fire Evacuation	 Continue outreach to dispel fires in the woods/backcountry. Alert Strategy: Emergency services will be using the high/low warning sirens to send evacuation alerts. Register for Nixle, as first responders will be pushing notifications there first. It is the best resource. OES hand-cranked radios aren't the most successful strategy. Law enforcement does not have the capacity to patrol remote areas. In the evacuation event, encourage people to get to communal spaces where people can assist. 	Register for CCTT's Resource Sharing Meeting for an in depth discussion from OES.
